GOAL: Reduce the incidence and mortality of tobacco-related cancers

ACTION PLAN

STRATEGY 1: Support expanded access to and promoting the use of comprehensive tobacco cessation programs and services

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- Target population is adults and adolescents of all socioeconomic backgrounds
- The community and region that St. Joseph serves experiences a high incidence of lung cancer. Additionally, lung and bronchus cancer is the 2nd most commonly diagnosed cancers in the States of Idaho and Washington amongst women and men. In the state of Idaho, 87% of lung cancer deaths are attributable to tobacco use.
